The Partnership Continues

In ongoing efforts to address the short and long-term infrastructure and Capital improvement needs, City and School Leadership met with residents on Tuesday, Dec. 4, 2012 at the second "Your Voice. Your Community. Our Future." meeting. Participants were provided a presentation on Capital Improvement projects suggested by residents at the



first community meeting in October. Then they were asked to help prioritize these projects using hand held response devices. This was a very insightful and educational meeting for staff and residents alike. Participants could see the results immediately after they pushed the button on their device. The process was worthwhile and helped City and School staff to better understand the needs, thoughts, and priorities of those present representing our community.

Dr. Magouyrk and I will be presenting the information gathered at the two community engagement opportunities at a meeting on Jan. 7, 2013 at 5:30 p.m. at the Historic Candy Factory on Battle Street in Old Town. This meeting, hosted by the City Council and School Board, will be a joint meeting to hear the results of the Joint CIP process and staff recommendations. The public is welcome and encouraged to attend.

Once the recommendations are shared, there will be a great deal of work to be done. After the Jan. 7 meeting, both entities, the City and Schools, will continue



with on-going meetings and budget deliberations throughout the spring. We encourage your on-going participation and feedback.

Thank you for all of your assistance as it is our sincere desire to develop a plan that truly reflects "your voice" as it is "your community."

Let it Snow, Let it Snow. . .

Concerned about snow this winter?

The City of Manassas is ready to clear the roads if/when it snows this winter with 16 snow-removal trucks, 22 pieces of contract equipment, 1,500 tons of road salt and almost 500 tons of sand.

What can you do to help?

Remove all snow and ice from the sidewalk in front of your residence. This is a nice thing to do for other residents and it is a requirement in the City code.

Don't park on a snow emergency route if snow is in the forecast. These are streets that will be plowed first in a snow/ice storm. Four hours after a snow emergency has been declared, cars may be ticketed or towed to clear the route.

How can you save money on your heating bill?

- Get your furnace cleaned and checked regularly.
- Check air filters and change them.
- Turn on ceiling fans, but reverse the direction, to direct heat more evenly in your home.
- Use natural sunlight when possible to help heat up the home. Keep blinds open.
- Make sure you insulate the water heater.
- Use a programmable thermostat.
- Use weather strips or caulk to seal up air leaks.

 Make sure your home is properly insulated and use cover outlets along outside walls.

The Courtesy Truck

Did you know that the City of Manassas has a Courtesy Truck? It can be rented by residents and small businesses of the City to haul trees, bulk items, brush, trash, cement, and furniture. (No hazardous materials like oil, paint, or televisions.) The truck is a Street Department truck used during the day for City business. It has an 11X14 ft bed. Once scheduled through the Street Department (703-257-8378), City employees will park the truck where you want after their work day, between 3-3:30 p.m. Residents fill the truck up, then around 7 a.m. City employees pick the truck up. The cost is \$75, which includes the disposal costs. Residents can rent the truck during the week or for the weekend, the cost is the same. The rental must be paid at the Treasurer's office 24 hours ahead of the time scheduled.

Stay Warm & Dry when Parking

- Press any key to get started
- ☑ Enter the parking space number where your car is parked.
- ☑ Swipe your credit card
- ✓ For a receipt, press the receipt option. It's that simple and your car is not out in the elements while you are at work. Daily parking in the metered spaces is \$4.50, 12 a.m. to 11:59 p.m., Monday-Friday, located on the top floors
