After an extensive search of highly qualified applicants the City has hired Robert Lee Clemons, Jr. as Fire and Rescue Chief for the City of Manassas.

“I have spoken to numerous people, from Fire Chiefs, Fire and EMS staff, to community members and they all speak highly of Rob,” said City Manager W. Patrick Pate. “I know his experience and leadership will be a great asset to the community and the Manassas Fire & Rescue System.”

Clemons has more than 28 years of career experience and 10 years of volunteer experience in fire and rescue services. He has multiple certifications in Emergency Medical Services (EMS) and Fire Services. He is a graduate of the

International Public Safety Leadership Institute and serves on many committees for the betterment of the community. He is a member of the International Association of Fire Chiefs, the Fire Department Safety Officers Association and the Society for Human Resources Management.

“I am excited to begin this new adventure and cannot wait to get started working for the City of Manassas,” said Clemons. “The sense of community in the City of Manassas is wonderful and I look forward to being a part of it.”

Clemons began on June 20, 2016 and was sworn in officially at the June 27 City Council meeting.

Kusterbeck has worked extensively to evaluate new equipment and has recommended updating protocols to improve the Fire & Rescue System. She assisted in the implementation of new ventilators and video laryngoscopes this year. She provides outstanding patient care and remains calm under pressure.

This fall Northern Virginia EMS award recipients along with honorees from Virginia’s 10 other regional EMS councils will be considered for the Governor’s EMS awards. The Governor’s Awards winners will be announced at the Virginia EMS Symposium, November 12, 2016 in Norfolk, VA.

Additional Trash Carts - Charges and replacements

The Refuse and Recycling Program provides City of Manassas residents in single family and townhomes with a trash cart and recycling cart/bin. Beginning July 1, 2016, residents will receive their first two trash carts and their recycling carts/bins at no additional cost. City residents requesting additional trash carts will be charged \$50 per cart. All damaged or broken carts/bins will continue to be replaced at no additional cost. Dumping Trash Can Cost You

Refuse and Recycling would like to thank City residents for calling to schedule bulk waste or large item collections. Over the past two years, there has been a decrease in the amount of missed and inappropriate trash left at curbside. Working together, we are helping to keep our community clean and beautiful.

Unsightly piles of furniture and trash left on the street, at curbside and in common areas are not only dangerous to vehicles and pedestrians, they can

become a magnet for more unwanted trash and animals. Under Sections 98.1-2 and 98.1-3 of the City of Manassas Solid Waste Code, violators can receive a civil penalty of up to \$5,000.00 plus costs of cleanup.
